What porous borders, rich soils, strategic navigational routes and ideological imperatives shape today's world? Territory expo brings together 32 artist and curator-led projects from 17 countries showing over 80 artists in 17 venues throughout Barreiro, Lisbon

Participating projects include Agencia de Borde from Chile, mothermother from New Zealand, Hi10 from Norway, nProjekt from Hong Kong, KNO from Ukraine, Grey Cube from Colombia, Season from USA, OSR from the UK and Imaginair from Belgium each with a different take on the theme, often informed by the geopolitical preoccupations of their respective regions.
